Trainers

- They will be able to set goals for their professional development and plan activities to meet those goals.
- They will be able to identify suitable resources and colleagues that can assist them with their development.
- They will learn to access and use suitable resources and ideas both within their classroom teaching and personal development.
- They will engage with other teachers through communities of practice.

Understanding professional development

3-hour session

**Wednesday 20
November**

Workshop Overview

The aim of this workshop is to introduce the participants to the concept of professional development and how it applies to them in their teaching career. They will discover a range of professional development tools and consider how they can support their professional development in relation to their own learning needs, interests and learning references.

The participants will identify immediate developmental goals and begin to make a professional development plan to help achieve these.

Outcomes

By end of this workshop the participants will be able to:

- define the term 'professional development'
- explain the process of developing professionally
- list a range of professional development tools and their purpose
- identify the most appropriate professional development tools based on their learning preferences
- write a professional development plan based on short term goals.

Engaging with assessment learning

The aim of this module is to explore key assessment for learning strategies – effective questioning, peer feedback, teacher feedback and self-assessment. You will plan how to apply assessment for learning strategies in your classrooms in ways which are relevant and appropriate to your learners and their context.

The module covers the following profession practices:

- Assessing learning
 - Utilizing a range of different types of assessments and feedback
 - Engaging your learners in self and peer assessment and developing their peer and self-assessment skills

By the end of this module you will be able to:

- Explain the principals of effective questions
- Use effective feedback strategies
- Develop your learners' self and peer assessment skills
- Show how to apply assessment for learning strategies in your context
