

GREAT Scholarships 2019-20

Term and conditions apply

1. The decision by an UK higher education institution (HEI) to nominate a candidate for the scholarship is the institution's independent decision and British Council will have no influence over this.
2. Each application will be reviewed by British Council panel based on predefined criteria.
3. Shortlisted applicants will have to sit for a face to face interview as part of the final selection.
4. The final selection and decision of the scholarship award will rest with the British Council's selection panel.
5. If you have been nominated by more than one UK institution for the GREAT Scholarships, your application form should clearly indicate which UK University you intend to attend. Only one application can be submitted per candidate with UK institution details.
6. Candidates must disclose on their application form whether they have applied, or intend to apply, for any other scholarships or awards. The decision to apply to other scholarships will not be held against the candidate for the final award
7. For undergraduate students, the scholarship covers the tuition fee for the first year of study only.
8. For postgraduate students, the scholarship covers the full tuition fee for one-year master's degrees, or the tuition fee for the first year of two-year master's degrees.
9. Selected scholars will need to make their own financial arrangements for the boarding, living and other on-campus expenses.
10. Selected scholars with conditional offers will need to ensure that all admission requirements. Once the final offer is shared by the UK institution, the candidate will need to confirm the admission offer with the British Council. Failure to complete admission formalities to seal the admission, will lead to withdrawal of the scholarship.
11. Scholars selected to the GREAT Scholarships will need to sign a scholarship award letter which lists all the terms and conditions aligned to British Council's policies.
12. Selected candidates will need to participate in all trainings, professional development and networking opportunities provided by the British Council in India and the UK.
13. The selected candidates must act as a brand ambassador for the British Council and their home country while in the UK.
14. Scholars are expected to engage on social media platforms during their stay in the UK and share their experiences about studying in the UK.
15. On return from the UK, scholars need to maintain contact with the British Council and contribute as a brand ambassador for Study UK by attending interviews and share experiences on platforms such as exhibitions and the pre-departure events
16. Once the UK HEI and the scholar has confirmed the programme and course details, no change in course area will be permitted without prior approval from the British Council. In exceptional conditions, if a request for course change is made, it will need to be within the subject areas/themes mentioned on the [website](#) and no additional payments will be made towards higher tuition costs.
