About our Courses

Our courses have been designed around the way children learn. By interacting, talking, and working with others, your child will learn English in an enjoyable, social and natural way. Our virtual lessons include live lessons with the teacher and self-study activities to be completed online before and after each live

The courses for secondary learners (11-17) integrates all the four skills that is listening, speaking, reading and writing along with language (grammar and vocabulary), real-life knowledge and 21st century skills that are showcased through projects and tasks mirroring real life language use. The focus shifts to academic and exam skills in order to help your child succeed in school exams and international universities.



The learning journey

Learning level Learning outcomes Weeks Through the definition and iteration of two project ideas, students will be introduced to a variety of reading text, speaking forms to develop interest in a wider range of 12 **Building** subjects. They begin to be inspired by their learning – weeks **Blocks** expanding the range of skills needed to read accurately, comprehend, and assess what they hear, read, speak, and write. Students will actively practise the language as they compare and share ideas on four projects. They will have developed the confidence they need to make their final 24 presentations. They also begin to experiment with their **Active practice** weeks own language, learning to take risks. They are much more independent than before and will be able to express themselves with better organisation of ideas and clarity of thought. We expect students to speed up their acquisition of vocabulary, reading and writing complex arguments. They do this through autonomous learning as well as 36 peer learning. Their abilities to question and experiment **Acceleration** weeks with language become more evident and prominent. Language learning accelerates as they become intrinsically motivated to do better. At this level, students will have become autonomous. They will carry the joy of learning, and the confidence of having developed strong grammatical structures. 48 They use the speaking skills built up over the foundation. **Advanced** weeks fluency, and acceleration modules boldly and assertively. They are also able to deliver advanced arguments with

cogency.
