






Technology with blended provision: our students study independently online, or with additional campus-based support at UoL Recognised Teaching Centres


Just over half our students are at Teaching Centres... and nearly all our students at Teaching Centres are undergraduates

UoL in India

- Longstanding engagement going back more than a century
- Notable alumni include Mahatma Gandhi, who registered for UCL (Law) in 1888-89, as well as the Bengali Nobel Laureate, writer and philosopher Rabindranath Tagore
- Currently there are 1,200 students in India taking University of London degrees
- Around half of these are undergraduates that receive academic and pastoral support from institutions in New Delhi and Mumbai.





Democratising international education through **ODL** cannot happen without:

- confidence in the **quality** and **standards** underpinning the provision;
- a focus on student outcomes, rather than mode of study





Promoting high-quality HE through ODL: six pillars




Our quality assurance framework: the same for our transnational provision as it is in London






