In the Beauty industry, when applying make-up, colour is not only chosen to complement the client's natural colouring but can also be used to neutralise unwanted tones on the skin.



WHAT ARE PRIMARY COLOURS?

- **Primary colours** are colours that cannot be created through the mixing of other colours. They are colours in their own right.
- All other colours are mixed from the primary colours.


THE PRIMARY COLOURS





WHAT ARE SECONDARY COLOURS?

Secondary colours are the colours you create by mixing your Primary colours together

THE SECONDARY COLOURS








WHAT ARE TERTIARY COLOURS?

Tertiary colours are the colours you create by mixing equal parts of one primary colour and one secondary colour.

WARM AND COOL COLOURS

- Warm Colours- yellow, yellow-orange, orange, red-orange, red, red-violet.
- Cool Colours- violet, blue-violet, blue, blue-green, green, yellow-green.

TERMS TO KNOW

- Hue:- another name for colour
- Tint:- colour + white
- **Tone**:- colour + grey
- Shade:- colour + black
